- I will treat supplies, materials, and camp space with respect.
- I will be open-minded, enthusiastic, and involved.
- I will listen to others.
- I will treat others the way I would like to be treated.
- If I ever feel uncomfortable, I will tell a trusted adult.
- I will try my best to uphold these Camp Shalom Values:

 - Hachnasat Orchim (Welcoming Guests)
 - Kavod (Respect)
 - Rina (Joy)
 - Ruach (Spirit)
 - Chesed (Kindness)
 - Tikkun Olam (Repairing the World)
 - Lev Tov (Big Heart)
 - Hakarat HaTov (Gratitude)

Use of epithets, innuendos, or slurs because of an individual's race, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, physical or mental disability, or familial status is prohibited at camp. Camp Shalom is a supportive environment that seeks to encourage the personal growth of campers.
